These pathways are designed to help students acquire essential skills and knowledge to prepare them for their chosen career. Our JROTC program is an amazing opportunity to explore a military option for those who are interested.

As we prepare to move to the new Torrington High School, we see amazing opportunities and challenges that we will tackle together.



GUIDANCE

Lao Tzu's famous proverb - that a journey of a thousand miles begins with a single step - has never proven more true than when one thinks about their high school career. Torrington students should know that attending Torrington High School is one of the most important steps they can take! As a school counseling department, our goal is to boldly disrupt the barriers that stand in the way of our students' success - this includes their academic, postsecondary, or social emotional success. Each step our students take on their journey through the halls of THS is one more step on their path to who they were designed to be. The opportunities that exist at THS help prepare our students for whatever life may throw their way once they graduate and leave these halls behind.

Variety, Flexibility, and Opportunities.

At THS, opportunities abound. With over 30 clubs and organizations, an award-winning music and theater program, not to mention the access our students are provided to college partnerships, engaging in one's learning is the ultimate goal. THS offers a variety of electives - over 100 electives! - from Robotics, to String Orchestra, to Computer Science, and beyond. There is an elective for just about any interest area and our school counselors meet with every student at least once per year to develop a course plan that will meet their unique needs and goals.

Many of our students take part in Independent Studies or Teacher Assistant opportunities. If our students exhaust a content area and still want to delve even deeper into their interests, we allow the flexibility for our students to take an Independent Study based on their interests (with teacher and administrative approval, of course). We also offer opportunities for upperclassmen to work closely with teachers as a Teacher Assistant (TA) and earn high school credit for their work. Our Teacher Assistants assist their lead teacher in classroom, lab, or activity prep - and, depending on the TA's goals and interest, may even develop and deliver a lesson to an underclassmen class. These opportunities have proven life-changing to our students who have taken advantage of them. Our TAs have also created strong relationships with their lead teachers which has led to deeply beneficial experiences for both student and teacher.

Early College Access

Torrington High School provides extensive opportunities for students to earn college credit while still in high school. THS offers 12 UCONN ECE Courses - courses for which students earn college credit at the University of



Connecticut. THS boasts the most UCONN ECE offerings, and most students enrolled in UCONN ECE courses, in Litchfield County and of any school of similar size and demographic in our state. We currently have 191 students earning a total of 1,160 UCONN college credits! In addition, THS offers 6 Advanced Placement classes. Students who take these courses have the opportunity to sit for the AP tests in the Spring for which they could earn college credit.

THS also partners with Northwestern Connecticut Community College (NCCC) to offer dual enrollment English and Science courses. Through this partnership, students will earn college credit at NCCC for their current THS classes with their THS teachers. Students may also

participate in NCCC's High School Partnership Program, which allows THS juniors and seniors to take courses at NCCC on campus for free! Currently, we have 19 students participating in the High School Partnership Program for the Fall of 2023. They are taking classes on campus with current college students and getting a taste of what college classes (and college life) are all about.

Access to the college experience is one of the highest predictors of students' postsecondary success - and so it is a priority to expose all of our students to the many opportunities that THS has to offer in this regard. Most students taking advantage of the opportunities listed above will graduate from THS with anywhere from 10 to 20 college credits under their belt. In recent years, several students have graduated THS with upwards of 60 college credits - that's two years worth of college credit - before they even go to college! These opportunities are just another step in the journey of our students' life-long success.

THS students are met on their journey by teachers who are engaging and caring. Our faculty and staff work to create an environment that supports learning. Our school counselors depend on a holistic and developmental approach to student learning and social-emotional development - especially when our juniors and seniors begin their postsecondary planning. As a school counseling department, we employ a hands-on approach to post-secondary planning. We plan parent evenings with presentations on college funding and college planning. We partner with local colleges and organizations to host FAFSA Workshops with translation services for our Spanish-speaking families. Throughout the year, we offer several college and career field trips and morning workshops. The school counselors provide a multitude of opportunities for our students to engage in their postsecondary planning and expose our students to as many postsecondary opportunities as possible. And, of course, the school counselors love to celebrate our students' success with ice cream trucks, pizza parties, and cupcakes as well!

Step by step, mile by mile, the THS school counselors walk alongside our students and encourage their success throughout their high school career. The journey may be long, but the years are short. As school counselors, we champion our students' every chance we get and provide the opportunities that will engage them - not only as they walk our halls, but once they launch from Torrington High School as well.

WOODWORKING

At THS there are several course offerings that are based out of the “wood shop.” Each of the four different courses begins with an introduction to the shop space, the machines, and the projects that will keep students physically active every day of the course. The experiences in the wood shop are designed to engage the body and the mind.

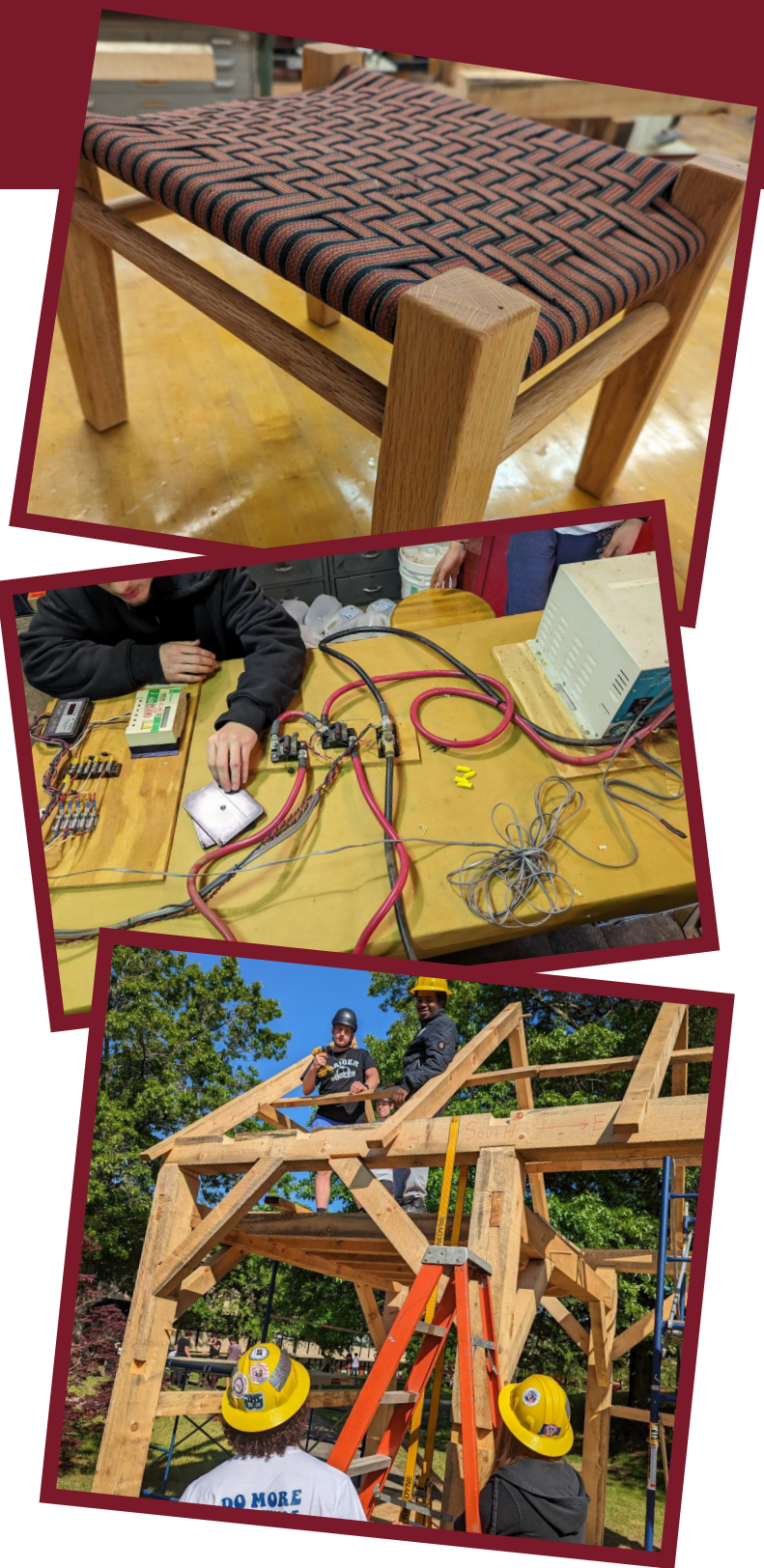
We constantly impress upon the students that the learning objectives target content specific to the state standards as well as 21st century learning skills. There is never a shortage of student discourse, collaboration, and problem solving. Additionally, an eye for safety is paramount. The value of the wood shop experience at THS is evidenced by the popularity of the courses, so be sure to sign up early in your high school career.

Wood Tech I - This course introduces students to the “wood shop” as a space that will become “theirs” once they demonstrate a level of competence, confidence, and independence on each machine. Student ownership of the shop becomes real as the teacher becomes more of a facilitator of learning and less of a direct instructor. Some examples of projects include maple cutting boards, wood pens, bird houses, serving trays and foot stools.

Wood Tech II - This class offers an even greater level of independence to the students. After a re-introduction to shop safety, the students are given more choice with the design and materials as they begin their projects. A more in-depth study of the machines, jigs and joinery techniques plays more of a role in the shop experience. Some of the projects in this course include human figure models, box-joint boxes, wood and acrylic pens, ice-cream scoopers, wands, and woven-seat shaker stools.

Construction Class - This course gives students the hands-on experience of building a 12'x16' timber frame barn. Students employ a number of construction techniques involving sharpening, measurement and layout, use of hand tools, use of antique machines and use of “state of the art” tools to carve as many as 60 timbers sourced from local forests. Additionally, students learn safety on the job site including personal protective equipment and the building of scaffolding. The culminating experience has students raising the barn in a single day after site preparation, leveling of the ground, and squaring up the sills.

Applied STEM - In keeping with the theme of hands-on STEM learning, the students in this course tackle three group projects. Taking advantage of the season and the



various species of maples here in New England, students learn how to make maple syrup. The project takes students all the way from the tree taps to pancakes on the breakfast plate while focusing on the science and engineering behind the processes and the preparation of the syrup. The second project has students using the CNC machine and various machines and tools in the wood and soldering shops to build a fully functioning electric guitar. Other STEM projects have included designing, engineering, and racing Pinewood Derby cars, as well as building a simple solar electric system or an earthen pizza oven.

CULINARY

At Torrington High School, the Family and Consumer Science Department is creating a stir, not just with its upcoming brand-new kitchen lab, but with a comprehensive culinary program that serves as a foundation for budding chefs and food enthusiasts. This program, deeply rooted in a tradition of excellence and innovation, is preparing to elevate its offerings to new heights with the completion of the new school building next year.

While the excitement for the new kitchen lab is palpable, it's the holistic approach to culinary education that truly sets the program apart. The curriculum, a blend of practical skills, theoretical knowledge, and creative exploration, is designed to inspire and challenge students. From mastering basic cooking techniques to exploring global cuisines and understanding nutritional science, the program covers a broad spectrum of culinary arts.

In anticipation of the new kitchen lab, the department is gearing up to integrate these state-of-the-art facilities into its already robust curriculum. This lab, mirroring a professional kitchen, will provide an unparalleled opportunity for students to apply their learning in a real-world setting. It will serve as a hub for innovation, where students can experiment with new techniques, ingredients, and recipes, under the guidance of experienced educators and chefs.

The beauty of the program lies in its versatility. Whether a student aims to pursue a career in the culinary industry, or simply wants to hone their cooking skills, the program offers something for everyone. For those looking to step into the professional world, the course provides a solid foundation in culinary fundamentals, along with exposure to the latest trends and technologies in food preparation and presentation. Students interested in further culinary education will find themselves well-prepared for advanced studies, having gained a comprehensive understanding of the culinary arts.

Beyond the technical skills, the program emphasizes the importance of creativity, teamwork, and leadership in the culinary field. Students are encouraged to collaborate on projects, participate in cooking competitions, and engage in community events. These experiences not only enhance their culinary skills but also help develop critical soft skills essential in any professional setting. As Torrington looks forward to the completion of its new school building and the inauguration of the new kitchen lab, the Family and Consumer Science Department remains committed to nurturing the next generation of culinary talents. AUTOMOTIVE

This quick discussion misses a more valid point intended for these pages. Few people are lucky enough to know what career they hope to work in at 13 or 14 years old. Most 18 year olds also struggle with this issue. Even many adults change this answer several times in life. If a student is lucky enough to know this, Vocational Schools, Charter Schools, and Magnet Schools do indeed make a great choice. For the rest of us a well rounded education, where ample variety to sample various career pathways plays a key role in helping to determine what we do, and occasionally comically do not, wish to pursue in life. When we add in the rapidly evolving world of A.I. and its very real impact on career training, skills, and at times even viability, a well rounded education should have much more value.

As a Tech Ed teacher in a public school, I do not feel compelled to claim that all of my students will be automotive technicians in the future. Some have discovered this desire, and it is my job to assist them in this pursuit. Most of my students gain a better understanding of safety, machinery, science, math, and economics. I have had students who thought it was their desire to work on cars discover that they really don't want to get dirty. I have also seen students, still college bound, completely change their life trajectory when they discover a career outlet which enables them to chase the science or math which they love. I have seen other students, who struggled or drifted through school, come alive at the realization that they can pursue a career doing something with their hands and minds.

When I came down to the tech wing, most students in the building did not know where tech wing was, or what happened down here. Our construction project has helped students find this end of the building, but many students, parents, and even staff are shocked to discover what we do down here. Occasionally, I will bring a high interest vehicle into the building, and it does make me laugh to see students peering in through the window. Many times they are shocked when I open the door and invite them in for a closer look. This year, a very similar event occurred during Parent Night. An older, rare, high interest Harley-Davidson (a long term project for an advanced student) was directly in front of my open door. It was amusing to see someone



stop in their tracks at the sight of the Motorcycle in the shop, and increased the number of parents I talked to that night by tenfold. Most parents, and still many students, are shocked to discover what we offer.

While the goal of education has always been to provide a high quality, well rounded education, society seems to finally be moving away from seeing this through the lens of traditional college being the only worthwhile option after high school. In the last half century, districts have gutted their hands on tech ed offerings. In the past decade, we have seen a value in CTE and STEM tech education return to public school at multimillion dollar expenses. Torrington has during that time, maintained a proud tradition of preparing students for a multitude of realities after high school, and providing hands on STEM classes. Yes, I do mean to say that THS has been doing CTE and STEM before they were “cool.” With out new building, we have proudly made the commitment to maintain and advanced these programs. Our new areas will continue to provide these valuable learning opportunities and career pathway exposure to generations of THS students.

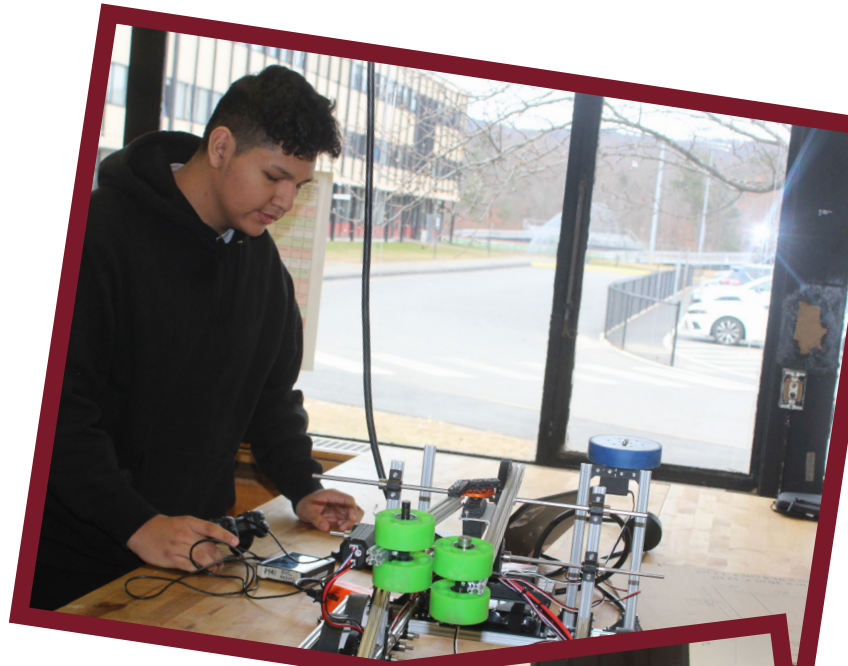

Excitement continues to build as our teachers actively pursue professional development opportunities. This summer, our Robotics teacher is set to attend the FIRST Tech Challenge Academy, a week-long program designed for educators offering this high school course, ensuring our students receive cutting-edge instruction. Last summer our Wood Technology & Engineering teachers attended a STEM Guitar workshop, adding even more to the STEM offerings.

In the realm of computer science, our Intro to Coding course, split into two sections, provides a full year of comprehensive learning. Recognizing the increasing importance of computer science in college applications, we've partnered with Code.org, a nonprofit foundation



backed by industry giants like Google and Amazon. Our students not only learn the fundamentals of coding but also gain practical experience with industry-standard programs like Visual Studio Code, creating real web pages.

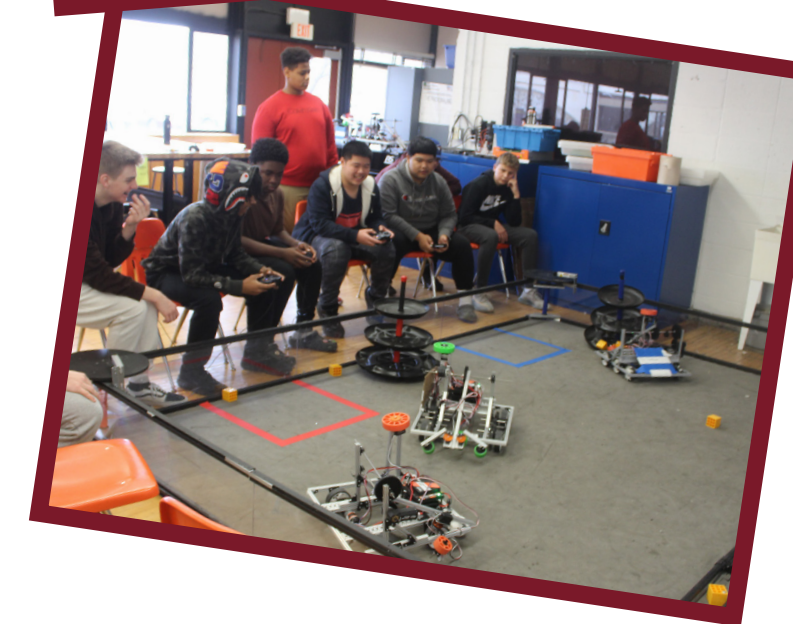
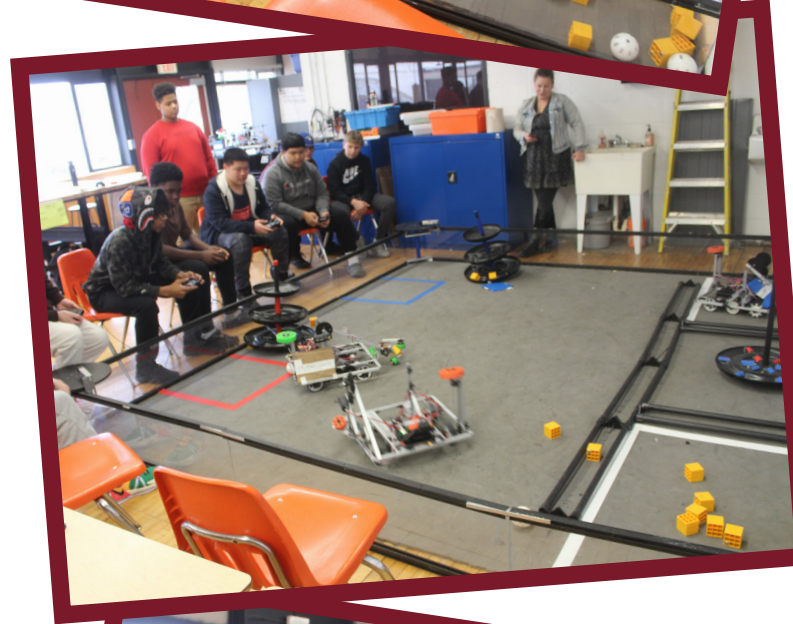
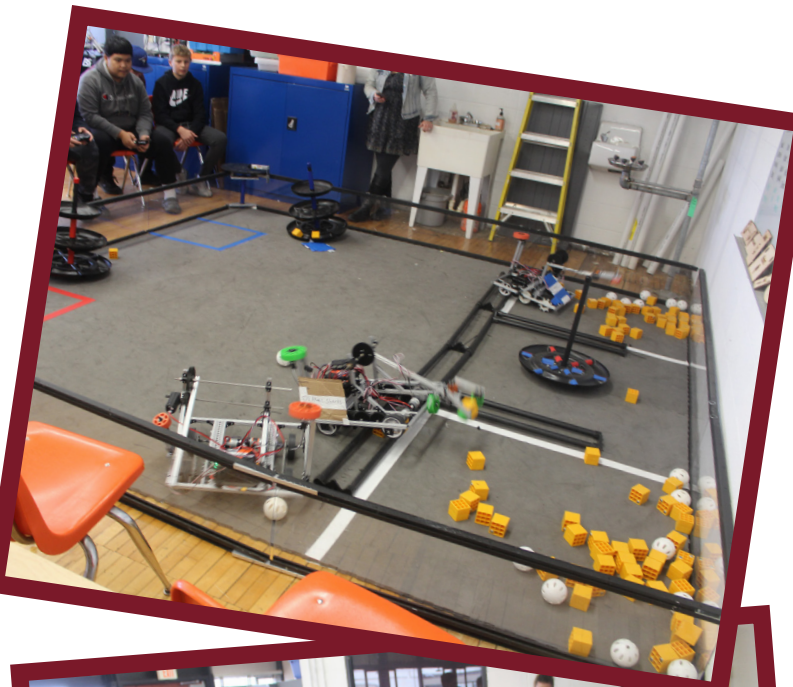
